Meeting Minutes

- Ron Golumbeck opened the meeting with Introductions from participants.
- Jim VanKouwenberg (Optimax) reported on his attendance at the NY State Regents meeting that Mike Mandina sat in on as a panel member. Many school teachers attended the meeting to voice opposition to moving to alternative tracks wherein the requirements for History or Social Studies might be diminished. Jim found his attendance was very worthwhile and he learned much about how the Regents view the proposed change to create an alternative STEM based track that does not anticipate immediate pursuit of a four year bachelor's degree by students.
- Jodie Daniels announced funding (\$100K) from WIA as a grant available for training. Trainings funded with these funds must begin by June 30th. There will also be additional funding available as of July 1st.
- Tarkus Murphy reported that he continues to work with Power, Real Estate and Data businesses to bring Smart Grid components to the Finger Lakes.
- Bob Aronson of Seneca County IDA reinforced the continuing support for FAME being provided by Seneca County IDA. He was pleased to be one of the founding IDA's that supported FAME in its startup and to see the tremendous progress being made on many fronts by FAME throughout the region, state and nation.
- Dr. Sam Samanta (FLCC) has 20 prospects for his Fall Instrumentation and Control Technology curriculum. He routed a sample of his new brochure for the program and announced that he is looking for co-op placement and full time placement for his current program participants.

- Mark Preston attended the RIT "Imagine" Fair. 1000's of students presented terrific entrepreneurial activities in all business categories. Very well done program!
