• From the Chair, Mike Mandina (FAME Chair; President of Optimax Systems, Inc.) FAME Folks,

I'm sure you are aware of work being done in our region to address poverty. At FAME, our purpose stays true to our tag line "Building minds that make it!" Manufacturers need skilled workers and those workers earn living wages. It will be impossible to solve the poverty problem in our region without the creation of wealth. Much of it will be created by firms that actually make things. Imagine if FAME members were to create 10,000 jobs over the next 5 years. That could have more of an impact than all of the foundation funding that is spent fighting poverty. Jobs provide the means to lift a family, a neighborhood, in fact - a whole region, out of poverty.

When asked about manufacturers employing people who are currently living in poverty, my answer is consistent. I advocate that most of these people are employable, and that the training required for most of them to insure employability by advanced manufacturers will be intensive and expensive. It is not practical to expect employers to provide that training. Most of the needed training has nothing to do with actual manufacturing. It is job readiness skills training, something most employers are not willing to provide, as we are generally able to find candidates who at least have reasonable work readiness.

FAME is working to insure that the poverty team is aware of the need for training and work habit preparation for those who choose to enter the manufacturing workforce. We continue to promote the Minor League Training program, where people from poverty work in a boot camp of sorts from six months to two years to develop the traits and skills that will insure their success at area manufacturers. To date, this initiative has not received funding, but we are still trying. We are hopeful, that even if the Minor League project is not funded, that others will adopt elements of the model and create employee development programs that will have manufacturers lining up to hire the graduates. Celebrating TWO Successful Summer 2016 SAME events!

Summer 2016 marked the expansion of the SAME – Summer Advanced Manufacturing Experience – to the east side of the Finger Lakes region! Made possible by a grant from the AT&T Aspire Foundation, and partners Monroe Community College and WFL BOCES, the newly expanded program was located at the WFL BOCES Williamson and Stanley locations. The east side program graduated 12 students, and offered tours at Harbec, Optimax Systems and OptiPro Systems. Participating students (9th and 10th graders), had the opportunity to experience first-hand advanced manufacturing skills

Running concurrently in July, the SAME west-side program graduated 18 students and had nearly 100% attendance. Students in this well established program toured Harbec, Micro Instruments, Optimax Systems, Parlec, SPX, Sydor Optics, The Gleason Works, and MCC's Applied Tech Center. Many of the students advanced through the projects with little help from the SAME staff, and there were many applicants to choose from as this program has grown in scope and size each year! Four of the students in this program were female, and the graduation ceremony was held at MCC's Applied Technology Center. Students in this program also earned 3 free college credits through MCC. A terrific turnout for both programs—and planning is already underway for 2017!
